The <u>Friends' bookstore</u> closes at 5:30 Monday thru Saturday.





Letter from the President

Can you remember your first visit to your public library? I was 7 when my mother, a trained school librarian, took her oldest 4 children to the Maud Burrus Public Library in Decatur, GA, and signed us up for our own library cards, complete with our names on them. I felt so grown up, being allowed to choose 3 books, keeping them at home for two whole weeks, then returning them to choose 3 more. Then, what fun it was to sign up for the Summer Reading Program, read 10 books, get our "Books Read" list displayed at the library and a certificate to take back to school in the fall.

Fast-forward to Spring 1978 and, one week after moving to Roswell, taking my 3 grade-school children to sign up for their library cards. Soon they, too, were signed up for the Summer Reading Program (SRP), checking out 3 books a week and completing their "10 Books Read" lists. Each summer they enjoyed placing their names on the SRP window, just as I had.

Happily, traditions continue, and now I have the genuine pleasure of taking my grandchildren to the Roswell library and watching them use their library cards to check out books, fill out their SRP lists, and put their names on the window, too.

In celebration of the joy of reading and the privilege of free library services, why not come and join the Friends in assisting the library staff to kick-off the SRP? You would then take renewed pleasure in visiting the "10 Books Read" window as it fills with names throughout the summer.

News and Notables

- ♦ The March book sale netted \$3141.50; 2200 books were sold. Thank you to everyone who assisted with setup, sales, and break-down and a huge thank you to all those of you who donated and who bought books.
- ♦ Donations for Jan.-Feb. were \$525.00 with \$500 of that in memory of long-time Friend Janice Tedford.
- ♦ Summer Reading Program preparations are off to a good start. This year's theme is All Together Now.
- ♦ We welcomed two new Board Members: Alan and Nancy Whithear.
- ♦ To renew your Friends' membership, you may go to FORL and print a form that you may mail with your check, or you may renew with cash, check or charge in the Friends' book store.
- ♦ The American Library Association reported that a record 2,571 unique titles were targeted for censorship last year, a 38% increase from the 1,858 targeted in 2021. Of the reported challenges, 58% took place within schools and 41% within public libraries.
- ♦ To show our patrons they are appreciated, the Friends assisted Librarian Cameron Hannon to become a Public Notary, available to assist the community.
