1955

Number of reels that make up the notorious Nixon White House Tapes collection held by the Richard Nixon Presidential Library (Yorba Linda, CA). As of 2018, the entire collection had been digitized.

6,400

Number of books housed at the <u>National First Ladies' Library</u> in Canton, Ohio. The library is part of the First Ladies National Historic Site, located at and around the family home of former First Lady Ida Saxton McKinley.
