The fun began June 1st with Roswell favorite Babatunde entertaining participants and continued into the summer with costumed characters, rock painting, a magician, storytelling and more. Programs continue until July 31st (see them all <u>here</u>), all designed to encourage reading and help avoid the well-documented <u>summer learning loss</u>. Experts agree, the effect of reading as few as four or five books over the summer can be large enough to pre-



vent a decline in scores from the spring to the fall and, in view of the current serious concerns about the effect of the pandemic on learning, this has become even more important.

Registrants sign up through <u>Beanstack</u> and earn badges and other credits throughout the summer. Roswell registrants who read five books also qualify for a Book Buck, which entitles them to choose a \$1 book from our bookstore. This is Caleb, 1st participant to qualify and to choose his book from the store; to date, 40 book bucks have been redeemed.
